



Online Child Sexual Assault Prevention & Awareness Training

Approximately 60 Minutes

Anyone working in a Maine school is required by law to attend child sexual assault prevention & awareness training within six months of their initial hire, and renew their certification every four years (LD 1180, February 2015). The preferred and best way to receive child sexual assault prevention & awareness training is in a live facilitated awareness session, but sometimes this option is not realistic so an on-line session has been developed.

2. When you have completed viewing the video:
 - ✓ Complete the MSAD 75 Child Sexual Assault Prevention Training. Employee Verification Form (on reverse side).
 - ✓ Set-up a meeting with a school employee who is a Certified Trainer.
 - ✓ Bring your completed Verification Form to your meeting and be prepared to review your answers. Once the trainer has approved you for certification, they will sign your form.
 - ✓ Send your signed Verification Form the Human Resources Department.
